- I was so tired and forget to do it.
- I was busy that it slipped my mind.
- I was in a rush and I forget to do it.

3. A promise to improve or to do better next time.

- o I assure you it will never happen again.
- I give you my word, I'll do on time from now on.
- o I promise I won't forget again.

4. An offer to do something to improve the situation.

- I'll stay late tonight to finish the report.
- o I'll buy you a new dish.
- o I'll replace tour vase.


